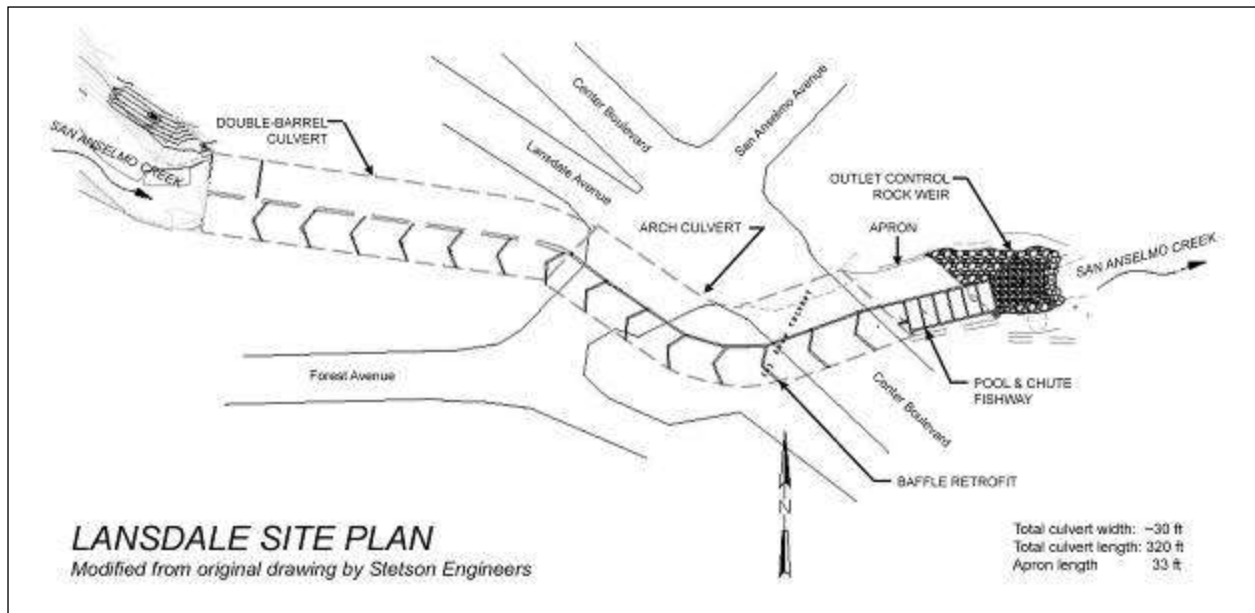


Helping Fish Move up San Anselmo Creek

Spawning steelhead find it almost impossible to get into and then through the long culverts—a pair of side-by-side box culverts upstream and a single arch culvert downstream—underneath the Lansdale Station Park and the adjacent streets in San Anselmo. Friends hopes that will change before too much longer. In late November, we submitted four permit applications for the project. When the permits are issued, the project will be shovel-ready, always a plus when seeking grant funding.

The project includes baffles in the right-hand culvert to provide resting places for fish as they move upstream and a series of pools at the downstream end of the culverts to direct the fish into the baffled sections. Additionally, a low wall across the upstream end of the left bay culvert will divert low flows into the baffled right bay and another low wall between the left and right sides of the arch culvert will keep water in the baffled right side.
